

TOWN HALL RESTORATION


Renovation continues of the old town hall. All of the furniture, files, etc. that were held there were taken out of the building and stored in two other places until the project is ready for them to be returned. Work that has been done since the last newsletter: partition wall framing around the furnace room was heightened to the original ceiling; temporary repairs to the roof of the structure and the outhouse were made due to leaks from lost shingles; repairs still needed on the foundation which held up blowing insulation in the walls, bids for insulation and a new roof (for metal as well as three tab shingles) are being sought. We have received another donation of \$40 from Corcoran and Harnist for renovations.

CHANGING BOUNDARIES



The first Hamilton County settlers arrived in 1788 at the mouth of the Little Miami River on the Ohio River. From 1790 to 1803, Hamilton County was part of the Northwest Territory, and the boundaries of the county changed ten times. At one time Hamilton County stretched as far north as Canada and into Indiana. After Ohio became the seventeenth state in 1803, there was only one further small boundary change.

"The Gore" was a triangle of land in the southeastern corner of Indiana. The area was bounded by the Ohio River to the south, the Indiana-Ohio border and the Greenville Treaty line to the west. This part of Indiana stayed part of Hamilton County, Northwest Territory even after Indiana Territory was formed. The "Gore" became a part of Indiana Territory only after Ohio became a state. It existed from June 22, 1798 to March 1, 1803. It contains the present Indiana counties of Dearborn, Franklin, Ohio, Randolph, Switzerland, Union and Wayne Counties.





In southwest Hamilton County, Ohio, Whitewater Township was formed in 1803. It encompassed all of what is present Whitewater, Crosby and Harrison Townships. That same year Crosby Township formed from the five northern sections and was recorded as Township 2, Range 1 East-Sections 1-3, 10-15, 22-24; Township 2, Range 2 East-Sections 2-9, 16-19. Fifty years later Whitewater and Crosby Townships relinquished land for the creation of Harrison Township. These lands were recorded as Township 2, Range 1 Sections 4-9, 16-21, 28-33.
