## *Congratulations on New Baltimore's Bicentennial*

Samuel S. Pottenger, a native of Maryland, purchased 602 acres of land in southeastern Crosby Township along the Great Miami River in 1815. He had a portion of it surveyed on February 27, 1819 to establish a town. It was then recorded in the Hamilton County Court House on June 21, 1819. The town was named after the city of Baltimore, Maryland and had 123 lots. Two lots in town were donated to the United Brethren Church. On the bank of the river, a flour and saw mill was built. By 1830 eighty-nine people were living in town. A grocery store, a blacksmith shop, and a manufacturer of wagons found their place in this hamlet. The 1874 post office could not use the name of Baltimore, since that name was already used elsewhere in the state. Thus it was called the Sater Post Office, because the Sater family had purchased some of Pottenger's original land in 1853. As the years passed, other businesses churches, and organizations found their home there. On April 8 the Crosby Township Trustees issued a proclamation to commemorate this milestone. They have also purchased signs that were placed along the roads recognizing the Bicentennial.

### Lease Update

At this same township meeting, the lease between the Society and the Township Trustees concerning the Old Town Hall was voted on and signed. A copy of the lease was on view at the regular April meeting of our Society.



## Memorial Day Celebration

Crosby Township citizens faithfully gathered on Sunday, May 26 for the 104th Memorial Day Services at the New Haven Cemetery to honor local men and women who fought in various wars to keep our freedom secure. These soldiers, some who are still with us, some who have since passed on, and some who gave the ultimate sacrifice were celebrated with a parade, speeches, and music. Our Society participated in the parade and in the reading of the names of veterans who have passed on. The Old Town Hall was not opened this year due to renovations but a canopy was set up outside the hall where free cookies and drinks were available to those who stopped by.
