

The Friends of Whitewater Shaker Village held an open house on the afternoon of Sunday, November 8<sup>th</sup>. The tour included nine buildings on the site including the 1827 Meeting House which is the last surviving brick meeting house and one of only two surviving Shaker meeting houses among the seven Shaker communities established in Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana. Restoration continues on the structures and grounds of this Crosby Township treasure.

### **New Haven School**

In 1896 a two-story brick school building was built to replace the old frame building which sat opposite New Haven Cemetery. In 1906 The New Haven school Board established a "three year high school" on the second floor. The higher grades were held there from 1906-1912, and again from 1920 to 1925.
