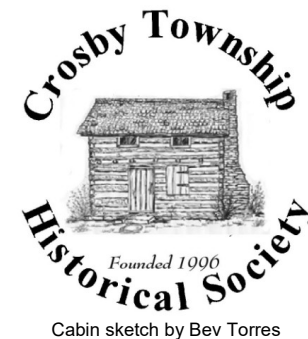

MEMORIAL DAY PARADE

The Crosby Township Memorial Day Parade took place on Sunday, May 28th. The parade took its normal route from the Community Center on Wiley Rd., out Oxford Rd. to New Haven Cemetery for a memorial ceremony. The Wm. H. Harrison High School Marching Band participated and provided the National Anthem; American Legion Post #199 Funeral Detail and the VOCE Choir also participated.

Crosby Township Fire Chief Bruce Downard was the Grand Marshall. CTHS members provided refreshments at the Town Hall following the event.

TOWN HALL RESTORATION

Currently the Society's accumulated and donated documents and items have been housed in the township's Old Town Hall leased to the Society by the township officers. Over the years, the interior of the old town hall has been changed. It was decided by the Society's Board of Trustees that it was a worthy project to restore the building with the intent to bring back some of its former décor as well as update its efficiency. Work began in the Spring after the Society's documents and items were packed away. Member volunteers tore down the suspended ceiling, paneling, unnecessary ductwork, etc. just in time to discard the debris in the township's dumpsters during Cleanup Days. Some items, like the ductwork, were reclaimed by township maintenance. Work was halted when a swarm of honey bees made their residence in one of the building's walls under a window. The bees were saved and moved by Christy and Scott Moses to restart a new hive. Much work is yet to be done. Donations of time, money, and/or materials are welcomed. In Case You Missed it . . .

At the April meeting, author, Ann Senefeld, (website “Diggingcincinnati.com” and book “Finding Your Homes’s Ancestors”) used examples of two historic Crosby Township houses and traced the families who lived there using websites of the county auditor, recorder, city/counties directories and other resources to do this type of research.

In May, Jessica Doty, Miami University graduate came with her vast collection of WWII era sheet music and played a number of pieces with lyrics on a screen. The music of that time was such an important means of support for our troops. The Army Special Services initiated waterproof boxes complete with replacement needles, more than 3 million “V-discs” were shipped to U.S. troops. Hand-cranked record players brought alive the recorded sound. Sheet music of these songs was the craze of the day for those on the home front.

The June program was “History of Historical barns in Ohio.” by Dr. Steve Gordon, Museum Administer-McGuffey Museum, Miami University, Oxford, Ohio. Dr. Gordon had a wonderful PowerPoint presentation on historical barns, mostly in Butler County. He explained how German barn builders were brought here to instruct the local farmers on this engineering; the lumber used and the many that still stand today.
