March: An Important Meeting

New beginnings are always important. They set the pace for the start of something worthy of our effort and careful attention. March is the beginning of the new season for our historical society. It will open the year with some old traditions, and the start of some possible new ones.

In March we will be working once again with a limited number of board members. They are a loyal and very effective group of people. The officers are: Melba Guard, President; Tony Torres, Vice President; Chuck Heis, Treasurer, plus two Trustees. We have not secured a Secretary yet, and are hoping that one of our members will volunteer for that position. To supplement the Secretary's responsibilities, we are using the President's agenda page in place of minutes for both the board meetings and the regular meetings.

In March the two year position of Trustees will be up for a vote. We are working with two positions instead of three. Mike Minges and Duane Singleton have chosen to run once again. The third position is open and waiting to be filled. Responsibilities of the Trustees are that they attend both meetings, and oversee that the Society follows the bylaws established from the inception of the CTHS.

The board has decided in our March meeting to reopen discussion on whether to change our meetings to Saturday morning from the third Thursday of the month. In September it was decided to have Saturday as our meeting date for October, November, and December of 2023. The decision for further consideration is the concern that there will be too much confusion changing the time for only three months. There is the possibility of taking a field trip within the township and always looking forward to having interesting speakers.
