# A Dear Friend is Gone

We are sorry to announce that Larry Shad, a long time member and friend of our Society, passed away March 22 of this year, Larry had pneumonia for the third time as a result of contracting Covid in September 2022. He was briefly in the care of Hospice of Cincinnati, Mt. Healthy where he died surrounded by his family. He was 90 years old.

Larry was civic minded and served on Colerain Township and Hamilton County commissions as well as Colerain fire department. He devoted many years of leadership and service to the Coleraine Historical Society and was a founding member of Colerain Heritage Park. The last few years he conducted guided tours of that park. At our regular monthly meetings, Larry gave reports of the functions of the Coleraine Historical Society. His attendance will be greatly missed.

Larry was interred at Dayton National Cemetery, Dayton, Ohio.
